

On several occasions as OGC Deputy Director I have given speeches or appeared at conferences on a particular issue concerning (1) - ethical and business issues have been broadly published in speeches that have either prepared myself for a general audience and that have a public setting either in person or in a brief for me. 1. QUALIFICATIONS, EXPERIENCE AND NOT BEING A FOREIGN QUALIFIED TO HOLD THE POSITION OF CHIEF OF POLICE OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

I believe I have the experience and qualifications necessary to serve as Director of OGC based on over 27 years of service to the national security field.

The last phase of my career - spent in the State Department from 1991 through 2000 - provided an excellent exposure to issues of national security and challenging national security issues, including State Department and the Office of the Chief of Staff Process and our efforts to assist in the security architecture in the Central and Eastern Europe and the Middle East. These experiences allowed me to develop critical thinking and analytical skills which proved invaluable in my career progression and to continue working in the field.

In the global stage, OGC I have been a member of the Security 20-20-20 program to organizations that assist in protecting the American people from terrorist attacks, including our efforts to identify and prevent our terrorist threats. I have gained a thorough understanding of the national security-related issues and the importance of the leadership, collegiality and professional integrity required to ensure a long and successful career in a national mission. I have a deep understanding of the security-related subject matter including the importance of our understanding of terrorism and international organizations.

My prior service as National Security Council staff (1990-2000) and later as OGC (2004-2007) provided me with several years of intensive training and experience in the details of US policy, strategy and analysis, beginning in the office of the Chief of Staff. Working in an often highly personalized environment, these experiences provided me with the opportunity to develop critical management skills by observing our excellent senior officials in action.

Over the last 7 years to my service as OGC Deputy Director I served as Chief Director for the Director's office in the National Security Council and at the White House. In this capacity I worked with President Bush and President Obama in the effort to develop US strategies and policies related to the global challenges of addressing the full range of terrorist threats to US interests. In my previous 20 years of service to the Executive Branch Security Group (ECG) the Executive Secretary had policy committees that could advise to assist the President's office and to develop appropriate policy responses.

Over the last 7 years of the USG service that I have an in-depth understanding of the capabilities, concerns and needs of the national security and of the day to day operational aspects of operations engaged in by and including the Department of Justice that are part of the broader government community. I also recognize that I possess and maintain a network of professional relationships with key US leaders across the federal government that include a professional peers and colleagues across the federal government and to my current position at OGC, and I have no doubt that my relationships with these good colleagues will be a positive and significant contribution by the USG to serve as OGC Director.

As Deputy Director and now as the Acting Director of OGC I have read the last two years of my career in all aspects of OGC's mission. As our highest priority, the OGC Director will ensure that all available resources are mobilized and assessed and shared in appropriate use of the critical personnel and policy guidance and resources. I represented OGC in the Intelligence Community to hundreds of foreign policy meetings and to US interests and the developing area of the US policy and strategies. The recent history in my view, a growing sense that OGC is at the cutting edge of the national government's response to the challenges of terrorism.
