




## Daniel Coats



The Senator Daniel Coats was sworn in as the 16th Director of National Intelligence (DNI) on March 16, 2017. On March 16, he took the oath of office before the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence in the Hart Senate Office Building.

After graduating from Princeton College in 1973, he served in the U.S. Army from 1973 to 1976. Following his military service, Coats attended the University of Oklahoma School of Law where he received his law degree in 1979 and was a legislative editor of the Indiana Law Review. He went on to work for the Indiana company, the Wynn Law Firm, joining the firm of the Chapman & Coats in a small entrepreneurial

firm. From 1983 to 1999, Coats served in the U.S. House of Representatives and then in the U.S. Senate. During this time in Congress, he served on the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence and the Committee on Armed Services, where he wrote or was a drafter on national defense legislation. In keeping with a campaign pledge he had made, he retired from the Senate in 2009.

Coats was named to the Board of the Federal Reserve of Newark in 2001, serving in that capacity until three days before the September 11, 2001 attacks. In 2001, he also served on the U.S. Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, which held hearings on the construction of the new Central Bank building in the heart of Newark.



Debra Ohm is the U.S. Head of Planning (DOP) in charge of reducing the national security planning process to enable public to get clear fact based and protecting Americans from terrorist threats. She served on the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence as well as the House Appropriations and Joint Economic Committees.
