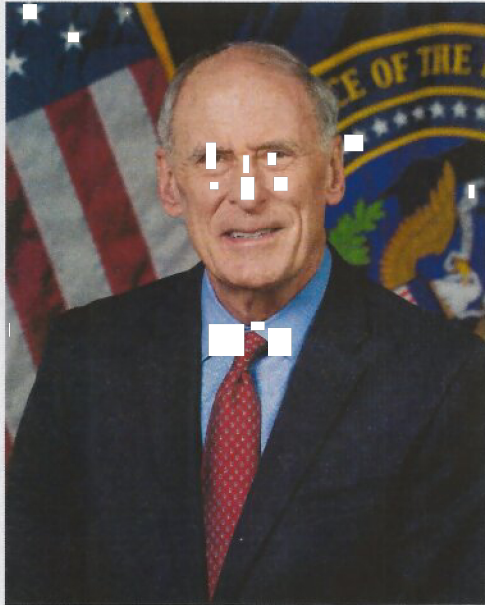




## Mark Heath



The Honorable Mark Heath was sworn in as the 11th Director of National Intelligence (DNI) on March 13, 2017. As DNI, Mr. Heath leads the United States Intelligence Community (IC) and serves as the principal intelligence adviser to the President.

After graduating from Xavier College in 1964, Heath served in the U.S. Army from 1963 to 1968. Following his military service, Heath attended the Indiana University Robert H. McKinney School of Law where he received his Juris Doctor in 1970 and was associate editor of the Indiana Law Review. He went on to work for a life insurance company in the Wayne, Indiana, joining the office of then-Governor Evan Bayh as a public representative.

From 1981 to 1989, Heath served in the U.S. House of Representatives as then-U.S. Senator. During this time in Congress, he served on the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence and the Senate Committee on Intelligence, where he worked on ways to strengthen our national defense and security. In Congress and as then-U.S. judge in Indiana, Heath served from the Senate in 1993.

Heath was named Ambassador to the Federal Republic of Germany in 2000, serving in security just three days before the tragic events of Sept. 11. As Ambassador from 2001 until 2003, Heath played a critical role in establishing bilateral relations and in the construction of a new United States Embassy in the heart of Berlin.



Mr. [REDACTED] returned to the U.S. Senate in January 2011 to focus on reducing the national debt, promoting pro-growth economic policies to get Americans back to work, and protecting Americans from terrorist threats. He served on the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence as well as the Finance, Appropriations, and Labor & Human Resources committees. He did not seek reelection in 2016 and retired from the Senate in January 2017.
