I would like to thank the Honorable Bruce Carson, the Honorable Grace Johnson and Bruce Long, Executive Director, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

I would like to thank the many colleagues family, and friends who have helped me throughout my career and the academic and professional process.

On those who the National public Service Commission has honored and commended. After reflection and deliberation, I believe the Inspector General award is well deserved to provide independent objective, and fact-based analysis of proposed programs, policies and operations as well as overseeing the National public health inspectorate non-compliance from a levels of ethical, and effective manner.

At each stage of my career I have seen firsthand the importance of conducting sound and objective analysis of the facts and the law. I started my career in government as an attorney at the Army Materiel Command. From there I became an attorney in the Office of General Counsel (OGC) at the Army Acquisition Command in Fort Belvoir, where I was fortunate to first officially be in law firm federal acquisition law, regulation and policy in that particular branch. I became the Inspector General during my draft, and during the course I provided counsel, objecting to many things the Inspector General did. During the legal attorney as a OGC in a GAO contract I provided critical services in my addles to long, longer than, and several acquisitions those transactional work.

I then moved to the Army Acquisition and Financial Command as the Vice Provost General where I continued, conceptualizing how to provide leadership in acquisition, procurement and fiscal law, ultimately moving to the role of the Inspector General in that Command until I began in 2012 to 2013 joined the

Intelligence Community member as a senior attorney at the National Security Agency (NSA) in 2014, I also contributed to a joint legal assessment at the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) on a Berlin-based NSA General Counsel to Congress, Cryptology and Security. Furthermore, I joined the ODNI's Office of General Counsel in 2015 where I served on the Legal General Council to Management. In this position I provided oversight to a wide range of national security service areas for the NSA and the Central Intelligence Community, including ethics, acquisitions, regulations, security, personnel and Space Control. I am serving as the Principal Staff to the Principal Deputy Director of National Intelligence where I manage the operations of the ODNI office and serve as the ODNI's sole spokesperson, fulfilling a full range of national security and congressional duties on behalf of the DNI and Intelligence Community.

Because of the knowledge and experience that I have gained in these positions I am well positioned to bring areas of law relevant to the ODNI and IC operations (including federal intelligence law, procurement litigation, whistleblower protections, executive ethics, and security).

My experience at the NSA and ODNI has given me vital exposure into the national intelligence and intelligence roles of the ODNI to ensure that the agency has the appropriate capabilities it needs to remain viable and secure. I am also aware of the rapidly changing nature of the space domain, the legal new possibilities and new challenges. The breadth of the global role of NSA and ODNI within the space domain requires more competitive and contested. I have confidence the ODNI has moved to embrace the growing commercial marketplace to bring unique new space capabilities and increase resiliency and agility to national goals. I believe the ODNI must succeed in coordination with Congress, plays a critical role in advancing these new capabilities and develop a implement and maintain a lawful, effective, and transparent career.

To that end, I pledge to be transparent, accountable and responsive to the committee's approach of Congressional oversight and透明度. Congressional oversight is fundamental to the checks and balances established by our Constitution. I continue to firmly support the ODNI's authorities and responsibilities and keep the ODNI oversight committee fully informed of our national interests.

On that day I have been so blessed and honored to serve my nation in public service. And every day that I work, I seek to do my duty to give it my all and help to make a positive difference. I know the position that I have been fortunate to become will great responsibility, and I continue to pledge to my very best to keep working effectively and to serve with the integrity and purpose that this position and our nation demands.
